Description

The ATLAS web site renders information about the ATLAS project, which aims at delivering a software platform for multilingual web content management unifying automatic annotation of important words, phrases and names, text summarization and categorization, and computer-aided translation. The web site features two areas – public and restricted. The public area is used for dissemination purposes and the restricted serves as an internal collaboration tool for the partners. The ATLAS web site was launched in April 2010 and includes the following information:

- Scope and objectives of the project
- Description of the consortium (with links to the web sites of partnering organizations)
- Expected results and their envisaged impact
- Who can benefit from the project
- Project news
- Information on project meetings
- Public deliverables and presentations
- Available dissemination material to download
- Links to other relevant projects and EU initiatives

Goal

The ATLAS website is used as the main information repository of the project, as well as for dissemination of news. The portal also provides access to ATLAS communities and to the ATLAS platform and its repositories. The project web site also serves as a fast and effective communication tool for the purposes of the project consortium, including communication with the European Commission and other stakeholders, as well as planning and arranging project meetings.

Access

The ATLAS web site can be accessed at <http://www.atlasproject.eu>. As already mentioned, there is a public area, which is accessible to all users and does not require registration. Non-registered users can see and browse all the content available in the public area. Registered users (consortium members only), on the other hand, when logged-in can view and modify the content published in the internal area. What should be noted here is that consortium members have their personal workspaces and can chose the access rights for the content they contribute to the web

Structure

Below is a list of the ATLAS web site pages:

Home: Provides a short description of the consortium and the main purpose of the project and references the EC's CIP ICT Policy Support Programme. In addition, the most recent entries from the *Newsletter* and *Events* sections are posted in the bottom of the page.

About: Discusses the problem at hand and the aims of the ATLAS project.

Mission and Vision: States the added value of the project.

Background: Gives more details about the software components, which form the foundation of the ATLAS software platform.

Organization: This page includes two subpages:

Management: Describes the structure of the Executive Board and its subcommittees, whose primary responsibility is to make sure that the project is carried out professionally and led to success.

Partners: Lists all consortium members along with some general organizational information and links to their web sites.

Work Packages: Lists all Work Packages, their short descriptions, tasks, deliverables and milestones.

Events: Lists project meetings and workshops, as well as conferences and events relevant to the ATLAS project.

Affiliations: Discusses the knowledge and expertise network, which will be developed around the ATLAS project.

Newsletter: Lists project news and newsletters.

Internal Area: Only consortium members can access this area, since it contains confidential information such as project documentation including deliverables, annual, periodic and financial reports intended for the EC only.

Technical Details

- The Knowledge Management System – a CMS developed by Tetracom IS – is used to set up the ATLAS web site.
- The web site has a Subversion repository, which facilitates the exchange of project documentation and data.
- Access to the internal area is provided through username and password after approval of a registration.
- Common formats such as .doc, .odt and PDF are used for public project documentation to ensure accessibility.
